When can I use the Library?

Your teacher will schedule time in the library for your class to do research on specific projects. All freshmen can expect to come to the library for an orientation with their social studies class.

You may also ask for a pass to go to the library from your teacher. You must come to the library with a pass signed by your teacher. The Librarian will ask you to sign into the library and will sign the pass for your return to class. If you are coming from a study hall, be sure to have your homework with you. You'll be asked what assignment you are working on.

The Library Media Center serves Nutley High School students and teachers. The Library contains over 25,000 books and subscriptions to over 60 magazines. We also have access to over 50 paid subscription databases and over 800 eBooks. Subscription databases and eBooks may be accessed from home -- ask the Librarian (Mrs. Bresnan) for a list of user names and passwords for home use.

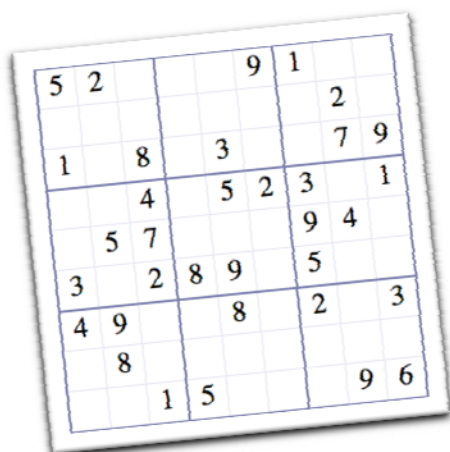

Other Useful Information

Databases and eBooks

Look for upcoming newsletters for information on how to use Subscription Databases and eBooks. These are resources we subscribe to (pay for). Mostly, they are digital versions of books, reference books, encyclopedias, newspapers and magazines. You can use these resources at home with a password.



Sudoku and Crossword Puzzles

We make copies of the daily Sudoku puzzle and the New York Times crossword. If you need something to do during lunch, stop by and pick-up a copy.

Popular Magazines and Newspapers

The Library subscribes to dozens of magazines of various interests. From "Time" and "Newsweek" to "People" and "Oprah" to "Sports Illustrated" and "Vogue." We also have several newspapers including the Star-Ledger, the New York Times and the local Nutley papers.



Computers, Copier Machine, Printer

There are 30 computers available for: searching the card catalog for books; using subscription databases; and Internet access. There is also a copier machine (\$.10 per page) and a black-and-white printer (no charge for printing but printouts are expected to be class related).
